

Acceptance and Enrollment Process

- Acceptances will be communicated via email and packets will be mailed out.
- Tuition
- Catholic/Non-Catholic
- / Enrollment opens at the end of January.
- Financial Aid
- Scholarship (Step Up)
- Change in Address
- Additional Fees and iPad



What happens next?

- Families will receive communication from the School Counseling
 Department to schedule a 30 minute appointment with the student
 and their guardians.
- What should I expect in the meeting?
 - Families will receive a form prior to the meeting via email with pre-selected choices. Students will be able to choose up to three elective courses of their choice.
- What if I don't meet the grade or scores requirements for a specific course at this time but meet criteria after receiving TerraNova scores?
 - Contact the School Counseling Office to update your test scores.



What happens next?

- Do I need a letter of recommendation from my current principal or teacher?
 - No, letters of recommendation are not considered in the placement process.
- Remember that freshman grades begin a great high school journey and future college acceptances.



Why is correct course selection important?

- All courses 9th-12th are calculated in the student's GPA.
- GPA is calculated based on the weight and grade earned in a class.
 - O Honors courses are offered in mathematics, science, English, social studies, world languages, and some electives. To qualify for placement in honors courses, there is a required grade average in a subject & a score in a designated percentile on standardized exams.
 - Incoming 9th-grade students must score in the 65th percentile or above on a math and/or reading standardized test or entrance exam and an A in Algebra 1, along with scoring an 85 or above on the Diocesan Algebra 1 Proficiency Exam for Geometry (H) placement.



Why is correct course selection important?

- O Honors courses carry a (.5) weighted designation. Prerequisites may vary, but all honors-level courses consider maturity level, self-discipline and self-motivation as characteristics students must possess.
- A student who earned a letter grade of a "C" will not be eligible to take an honors course in the same area the following school year.



Why is correct course selection important?

Advance Placement (AP) courses

- Incoming 9th grade students must score in the 90th percentile or above on the standardized testing or entrance exam on the reading or social studies section and an "A" in current year social studies course for AP Human Geography placement.
- AP courses carry a (1.0) weighted designation.
- A student who earned a letter grade of a "C" will not be eligible to take an AP course in the same area the following school year.
- Students enrolled in AP courses are required to pay and to sit for the end-of-course exam each May.

- Support for students with documented learning exceptionalities or other disabilities.
 - Ocumentation must state the specific disability as diagnosed by an appropriate professional and be current (3-5 Years).
 - Information presented must be educationally relevant, describe functional limitations, and include recommendations.
 - Ocumentation may be in the form of an IEP, private psycho-educational evaluation, or a 504 plan.
- Accommodations are individualized and provided based on BMC academic support plans.
- Students are expected to complete all assignments and graduation requirements.
